Some of the points covered in this programme are: the workplace should be kept clean and tidy; floor surfaces are important since many injuries involve slips, trips and falls; storage areas are a source of potential danger and should be checked regularly; maintenance of all equipment is vital in any workplace and staying vigilant, particularly paying attention to visitors and new employees will help to reduce injuries.

Hand aware

[Airport West, Vic.] : Vocam Video Training, [1995].

1 videocassette (VHS) (16 min.)

Describes how hand accidents may be prevented, including safe handling of machines and tools, glove protection, avoidance of repetition hand strain and immediate first aid for hand injuries.

Hand safety: the irreplaceable tools

Melbourne: Safetycare Australia, c1989.

1 videorecording (VHS) (17 min.)

Shows how injuries arise in the workplace and emphasises the importance of safe work practices. Also emphasises the importance of prompt attention to injuries.

Hand tools

Mt. Waverley, Vic.: Skills Education Australia, c1989.

1 videocassette (VHS) (16 min.)

This program discusses the correct and safe usage of spanners, screwdrivers, pliers and hacksaws.

Handle with care: manual handling

Oakleigh, Vic.: Safety Image, c1993

1 videocassette (VHS) (16 min) + 1 booklet

This video looks at risk identification; risk assessment and risk control in manual handling. It examines strategies such as mechanical aids, job rotation and layout of work in the setting of a chocolate factory.

Handling and storage of hazardous substances

Brisbane: Vocam, 1999.

1 videocassette (VHS) (16 min.)

Risk is reduced when people are aware of procedures, limitations and hazards when dealing with hazardous substances. Personnel should make an assessment of conditions and substances to be used before starting a job. No workplace wants people, property or equipment damaged through lack of or misinformation on the correct usage of hazardous substances.

Handling hazardous chemicals safely

[United States]: Allied Corporation, c1982.

1 videocassette (VHS) (15 min.)

This video deals with hazardous chemicals and their labelling; types of protective equipment; and what to do if something goes wrong. For example, procedures for dealing with spills.

Handling hazardous spills

[United States]: 3M, c1989.

1 videocassette (VHS) (17 min.)

Discusses how a workplace should be prepared for the possibility of a hazardous spill and what to do if a spill occurs.

Handling rubber: reducing manual handling injuries in the rubber industry

Sudbury, Suffolk: HSE Books, 1999

1 videocassette (VHS) (18 min.)

Handling causes over 40% of all reportable accidents in the rubber industry. This video shows what five different companies have done to eliminate these handling risks. The case studies include the handling of press tools, process materials, tyre casings and finished goods

Hangman

Denham, England: Millbank Films for the Building Employers Confederation, 1985.

1 videocassette (VHS) (18 min.)

A safety training film which uses the well known 'Hangman' game to illustrate safety in the construction industry.

Harassment: keeping it out of the workplace

Glen Waverley, Workwell Training Videos: Training Direct [distributor], 1998.

1 videocassette (VHS) (18 min.)

Provides a better understanding of the destructive and negative effects of workplace harassment by demonstrating different types of harassment and suggesting methods and actions to help eliminate its occurrence. Includes discrimination, medical, sexual and electronic harassment, deliberate exclusion and racism.

Hazardous atmospheres and respirators

East Malvern, Vic.: Safetycare Australia, 2004

1 videocassette (VHS) (17 min.)

Looks at what constitutes hazardous atmospheres as well as the acute and chronic effects on health. Discusses air-purifying and supplied-air respirators, their proper use and limitations. Addresses fit tests and user seal checks. Outlines selection of appropriate filters, cartridges and canisters. Highlights signs of respirator failure and discusses inspection and maintenance.

Hazardous substances: control at work

Sydney: Worksafe Australia, c1994.

1 videocassette (VHS) (20 min.)

A training tool outlining hazardous substances, identifies obligations and rights in the workplace and sets down the principles of the new Hazardous Substances Regulatory Package.

Hazardous substances: safety essentials

[Camberwell, Vic.]: Vocam Worldwide Publishing, c2006.

1 videodisc (DVD) (23 min.) + training guide

Hazardous substances are common in many work places. Unsafe contact with them can result in injuries both minor and major, both temporary and permanent. By conducting hazardous substance safety training your organisation can help avoid accidents and incidents. Topics covered include: identifying hazardous substances, common hazards, the hierarchy of control, personal protective equipment, storage and disposal, emergency response and case studies.

The HAZCHEM code

[East Malvern, Vic.]: Safetycare Australia, [2003].

1 videocassette (VHS) (15 min.)

The HAZCHEM Code, also known as the Emergency Action Code, provides vital information such as how to control a spill or fire involving hazardous substances, whether there is a risk of a violent or explosive reaction, what sort of PPE will be required in the event of an accident, whether a spill should be contained or diluted and whether evacuation should occur. This program aims to improve response to hazardous chemical emergencies, provide a greater awareness of the requirements for working with hazardous substances and the properties and risks of the chemicals kept and used in the workplace, give an understanding of the significance of the codes and improve the safety principles associated with hazardous chemicals.

Head protection

[Victoria]: Safety Care Australia, c1989.

1 videocassette (VHS) (10 min.)

Stresses the importance of correct safety procedures to prevent damage to the head - especially the eyes, ears and brain.

Health and hygiene essentials for the office

[East Melbourne, Vic.]: Vocam, 2004.

1 videodisc (DVD) (20 min.).

Looks at hygiene and health for office staff including how infections spread, infectious diseases, cleanliness at work, personal hygiene, health and fitness and food for health.

Heat hazards

[East Malvern, Vic.] : Safetycare Australia, [2005?]

1 videodisc (DVD) (17 min)

The program is designed to suit any work environment where heat may be a potential hazard, and provide people with a practical understanding of the types of control measures that can be implemented to reduce the health risks. Through increasing people's awareness of heat hazards the risk of heat related illnesses and injuries can be reduced.

Height safety essentials

Camberwell, Vic.: Vocam, c2006.

1 videodisc (DVD) (21 min.)

Complacency can easily lead to accidents when working at height. This program features safety issues and procedures for equipment used when working at height including scaffolds, fall arrest systems, roof work, ladders, trestles and elevated work platforms.

Help yourself to a better back

[Victoria]: Campbell Howie Productions: Training Direct (distributors), c1999.

1 videocassette (VHS) (15 min.)

A guide to back injury prevention for all employees. This video is suitable for both commercial and industrial work environments, presenting a range of activities and how to avoid causing stress and injury to the back.

Hospitality essentials

East Melbourne, Vic.: Vocam, 2002.

1 videocassette (VHS) (18 min.)

Hospitality essentials is a complete induction training programme for all personnel working in hotels, motels, restaurants, reception centres and clubs. Includes safe work procedures with an emphasis on duty of care when serving the public. Manual handling procedures and fire prevention and evacuation instruction are also presented.

How did it happen? : accident and near-miss investigation

Glen Waverley, Vic.: Training Direct, c1998.

1 videodisc (DVD) (18 min.) + trainer's manual.

"How Did It Happen?" is a training video in the style of a murder mystery, featuring an occupational accident rather than a murder. This novel approach leaves the viewer completely in the dark as to the cause of the accident until the investigation is concluded, holding the viewer's interest and attention throughout the session.

How to have an accident at work

[United States]: Walt Disney Prod., [1950]

1 videocassette (VHS) (7 min.)

Donald Duck is the object of mishaps in this cartoon encouraging safety in the workplace.

How to have an accident at home

[U.S.A.]: Walt Disney Productions, 1957.

1 videocassette (VHS) (8 min)

Walt Disney Studios use the popular character of Donald Duck to emphasise that care should be taken around the home.

Hygiene and health at work

Airport West, Vic.: Vocam Video Training Productions, c1994.

1 videocassette (VHS) (15 min.)

Personal hygiene at work limits the spread of infection. Care should be taken when handling food. An infection control unit should be part of the first aid kit.

I chose to look the other way

Glen Waverly, Vic.: Training Direct, [n.d.]

1 videodisc (DVD) (10 mins.)

This DVD dramatically tells a story of an employee who failed to speak up when witnessing an unsafe act. Whilst choosing to "look the other way" he contributed to the needless death of a co-worker. Based on a safety poem by Don Marrell, this program shows how to speak up about unsafe acts, which saves lives and helps develop a positive safety culture.

The induction series

Wantirna, Vic.: Channel 1 Training Videos, 2005

3 videocassettes (VHS) (c30 min.)

Provides an introduction for new staff to health and safety in the workplace, featuring 3-5 minute segments on each topic. Includes introduction, manual handling, lifting and carrying, ergonomics in the office, confined space safety, slips, trips and falls, eye safety, hearing conservation, electrical safety, fire safety, hazardous substances, emergency procedures, hand held power tools and machinery safety, forklift safety, moving vehicles, working at heights, drugs and alcohol, skin cancer, infection control and personal protective equipment.

The induction series

Wantirna, Vic.: Channel 1 Training Videos, 2005

A series of 5 minute refresher DVD titles that each cover one of the following topics (available separately)

1 videocassette (VHS) (17 min.)

Good ergonomics in the workplace enables personnel to do their job efficiently, while poor ergonomics can expose personnel to the risk of injury and ill health. This video is designed to train personnel to be able to identify ergonomic problems and find practical solutions.

Infection control for the workplace

[Brisbane]: Produced for Dept. of Administrative Services by Audio Visual Services, Dept. of Health, 1990.

1 videocassette (VHS) (11 min.)

This program outlines hygiene procedures and protective equipment to be used in the workplace. It responds to commonly asked questions about health hazards in high risk jobs such as plumbing and glazing in hospitals, prisons and drug clinics.

Injury and illness: emergency response, part 1.

Airport West, Vic.: Vocam, 2001.

1 videocassette (VHS) (20 min.):

Describes the appropriate initial responses to different injuries when there are no staff formally trained and certified in first aid on the scene. Outlines unconsciousness, amputation, electric shock, fractures, external bleeding, burns, soft tissue injuries and eye injuries.

Injury and illness: emergency response, part 2.

Airport West, Vic.: Vocam, 2001.

1 videocassette (VHS) (22 min.)

Describes the appropriate initial responses to different injuries when there are no staff formally trained and certified in first aid on the scene. Outlines poisoning, hypothermia, fainting, shock, stings, heat induced conditions, heart attack, unconsciousness.

Inspection, care and storage of slings

[Melbourne]: Safetycare Australia, c1994.

1 videocassette (VHS) (15 min.)

This video examines different types of slings and accessories. It looks at pre-use checks; care of equipment; periodic inspections and correct storage of lifting equipment.

It's enough to make you sick: the importance of food safety

[Glen Waverley, Vic.] : Training Direct, c1997.

1 videocassette (VHS) (17 min.)

Highlights certain aspects of food safety such as good manufacturing practices, food poisoning, personal hygiene, handling and preparation, as well as storage and display.

It's not Thursday--is it?

[Great Britain]: Millbank Films [production company], [1980].

1 videocassette (VHS) (20 min.)

Dramatised case study illustrating the casual, sometimes dangerous attitude that many people have towards office safety. Highlights the legal responsibility of both manager and employee.

Job safety analysis

[East Malvern, Vic.] : Safetycare Australia, [2001].

1 videocassette (VHS) (15 min)

Job safety analysis is discussed in examining a task to identify hazards. Changing a car tyre is demonstrated in raising safety awareness.

Kings of the road

Sydney: Future Media [distributor], [200-]

1 videocassette (VHS) (11 min.)

This video focuses on attitudes rather than driving techniques and uses the stories of three stereotypical drivers: the salesperson, the van driver and the 'few drinks after golf' driver. The premise of the film is that the occupational driver will relate to the attitudes expressed within the stereotypes and act accordingly.

Kitchen and canteen safety

[Mt. Waverley, Vic.]: Safetycare Australia, 1990.

1 videocassette (VHS) (13 min.)

Examines the need for safe work procedures; including the use of protective equipment and teaches awareness of potential hazards.

Ladder safety (available in DVD and VHS)

[Victoria]: Safetycare Australia, c1994.

1 videodisc (DVD) or videocassette (VHS) (10 min.)

This video looks at types of ladders, safe positioning of ladders and working on ladders. It also looks at safe use of rolling scaffolds.

Landscape maintenance safety

[Airport West, Vic.]: Vocam Safety and Training, c1992.

1 videocassette (VHS) (16 min.)

This video examines safety issues in landscape maintenance such as chemicals, chainsaw safety and personal protective equipment for eyes, ears and feet.

Learning from accidents: the Piper Alpha oil platform disaster: messages for managing safety

[S.I.]: VEC International Production for ICI Group Safety, 1991.

1 videocassette (VHS) (45 min.)

Brian Appleton outlines the Piper Alpha oil rig explosion and fire (North Sea, 10 p.m., 6/7/1988) in which 167 men died. Deficiencies in design, safety procedures and management compounded to cause the magnitude of the disaster. He offers the disaster as a grim lesson and draws conclusions for safety managers.

Lift trucks, pallet movers and trolleys

[Airport West, Vic.]: Vocam Video Training Productions, [1996?]

1 videocassette (VHS) (16 min.)

Demonstrates and explains correct operating procedures for a wide variety of pedestrian and ride-on stock moving equipment, including trolleys, lift trucks and pallet movers.

Lifting and carrying

[Melbourne, Vic.] : Safetycare Australia, [2000?]

1 videodisc (DVD) (10 min.)

Enables employees to understand their physical limitations, the nature of injuries resulting from poor lifting and carrying techniques, and the need to calculate the risk factors involved and thus reduce the physical risks inherent in lifting and carrying

Lifting your game: keys to forklift safety

[East Melbourne, Vic.] : Vocam Worldwide Publishing, 1998

1 videocassette (VHS) (22 min.)

Demonstrates safe operating procedures for forklift drivers. These include maintenance checks, parking, refuelling and safe driving techniques. Drivers should know the capabilities of their forklifts so they remain stable whether picking up, moving or storing loads. Being familiar with the workplace layout will also help drivers avoid accidents.

Lighten the load – featuring NAPO

Sudbury, Suffolk: HSE Books, 2007.

1 videodisc (DVD) (c10 min.): sd., col.; 4 3/4 in.

This DVD shows how to avoid musculoskeletal problems in the workplace. These serious messages are presented in a light-hearted manner and are ideal for training people. Each section highlights the problem and a potential solution. Sections deal with: fast-paced work and repetitive activity; moving and carrying heavy loads to prevent strain and injury; workstation height and layout; excessive and continual twisting; use of lifting aids to eliminate or improve manual handling; how to ensure good grip when handling tools; vibration and use of power tools; efficient and safe handling; thinking and planning about lifting and workplace movements.

The line of fire

Glen Waverley, Vic.: Training Direct, [2008?]

1 videodisc (DVD) (13 min.)

This program discusses many workplace hazards and outlines general principles that can help employees prevent these hazards from causing serious injuries and deaths. Featured are several incidents that illustrate the consequences of not noticing when we are in harm's way. Topics include hazards presented by gravity, moving machinery, flying debris and projectiles, automated equipment, moving vehicles, contact with stationary hazards and the importance of observation and feedback.

Lockout tagout

East Melbourne: Vocam, c2002.

1 videocassette (VHS) (16 min)

Lockout/tagout is a safety procedure used when maintenance on industrial equipment is carried out. This video covers: general principles; key steps to isolation; restrictive devices; tagouts; group lockout/tagout; multiple energy sources; hidden energy; electrical equipment; mechanical equipment and key steps to restart isolated equipment.

Look and see

[Australia]: Confederation of Australian Industry, Occupational Health and Safety Training Programme, [198-?]

1 videocassette (VHS) (12 min.)

Occupational health and safety film which aims to prevent accidents and injuries in the workplace.

Look up and live, look down and survive

Queensland: Department of Industrial Relations, 200-?.

1 videocassette (VHS) (10 min.) and/ or 1 videodisc (DVD) (10 min.)

This video looks at why workers die or suffer serious injury from accidents involving live electrical wires, overhead or underground, what went wrong and why the accidents happen to skilled workers.

Maintenance safety

Glen Waverley, Vic.: Training Direct, 200-?

1 videodisc (DVD) (18 min.)

Maintenance workers face a variety of hazards each day as work assignments constantly change. These workers must have a degree of skill and a good safety attitude to be successful. This program uses eleven accidents to illustrate the importance of building a wall of safety to protect yourself from the hazards.

Managing discrimination in the workplace

[Mt. Waverley, Vic.]: Videotrain, c1997.

1 videocassette (VHS) (20 min.)

Focuses on the managerial aspects of discrimination in the workplace and how they can contribute to the promotion and creation of a discrimination free work environment. Describes the terms "Direct discrimination and Indirect Discrimination", and the many forms that discrimination can take.

Managing stress in the workplace

Mount Waverley, Vic.: Videotrain, 1991.

1 videocassette (VHS) (17 min.)

Deals with the general causes of stress and the problems it can create in the workplace, such as accidents, absenteeism and decreased productivity. Suggests ways of overcoming stress related problems.

Manual handling: [for all workers]

Wantirna, Vic.: Channel 1 Training Videos, c2008.

1 videodisc (DVD) (18 min.)

Most jobs involve some type of manual handling, so essentially all workers are at risk no matter how minimal they believe their work to be. In this presentation, viewers will be taken through a range of tips, procedures and preventions for making the task they perform safer.

Manual handling: for hospital workers

Wantirna, Vic.: Channel 1 Training Videos, 1997.

1 videocassette (VHS) (20 min.)

In conjunction with the Australian Physiotherapy Association, viewers are shown how to correctly lift and carry, and taken through a series of stretches and warm up exercises that should be completed before and during the working day to help prevent the risk of injury.

Manual handling: the new approach

[Niddrie, Victoria]: Vocam Video Training Productions, c1990.

1 videocassette (VHS) (10 min.)

Demonstrates safe manual handling techniques for lifting and carrying.

Manual handling for industry

[Airport West, Vic.]: Vocam Video Training Productions, [1994]

1 videocassette (VHS) (22 min.)

Explains how to avoid back injuries by use of good lifting and carrying techniques and back stretching exercises, demonstrating good manual handling techniques for industry.

Manual handling for the office

Airport West, Vic.: Vocam Video Training Productions, c1994.

1 videocassette (VHS) (20 min.)

Investigates ways to prevent back injury in the office, by showing how the back works, how to use it correctly and how to keep it in good shape.

Manual tasks risk management

[St. Lucia, Qld.] : University of Queensland, MISHC, ACARP, 2004.

1 videocassette (VHS) (15 min.)

Provides information about manual tasks risk assessment and control which is needed to enable miners to participate in the management of the musculoskeletal injury risks associated with manual tasks.

Mary's message: a story of a workplace accident that should not have happened

[Broadmeadows, Vic.] : Industrial Deaths Support and Advocacy (I.D.S.A), [between 1990 and 2002]

1 videocassette (VHS) (20min)

Provides a unique insight into the consequences of a workplace tragedy and the impact it has on the surviving family. Mary's husband John died as a result of a workplace accident, and heard of the accident on the radio four hours after it occurred. She outlines the aftermath of the investigation and prosecution process.

Microbiological risks when working with sewage and sludge

Sheffield: Visual Presentation Services, Health and Safety Laboratory, c1995

1 videocassette (VHS) (12 min.)

Looks at safety issues and protective clothing which should be worn when working with sewage or sewage sludge

Moving things: lifting and carrying

[Victoria]: Safety Care Australia, 1988.

1 videocassette (VHS) (15 min.)

This video highlights the dangers of incorrect posture when lifting or carrying loads and recommends the correct approach to manual handling.

NAPO in...Risky business

Sudbury, Suffolk: HSE Books, 2008.

1 videodisc (DVD) (9 min.): sd., col.; 4 3/4 in.

This animated DVD follows the cartoon character NAPO in a series of sketches dealing with risk assessment in the workplace. It has a light-hearted approach but has serious messages. The DVD includes chapters on: Caution hazards; Assess the risk; Identify the unknown; Act on risks; Risky combination; Eliminate the risk; Safety pays.

Noise and hearing conservation

[Melbourne]: Safetycare Australia, c1989.

1 videocassette (VHS) (17 min.)

This program warns of the devastating consequence of hearing loss and shows what can be done to prevent hearing loss in industrial settings.

Noise and you

East Melbourne, Vic: Vocam Worldwide Publishing, 2002.

1 videocassette (VHS) (20 min.)

Discusses characteristics of noise and how ears handle sound. Outlines hearing protection, how to choose, wear, maintain and store it correctly. Highlights noise reduction methods, assessing daily exposure and warning signs of loss and the need for audiometric testing.

Noise induced hearing loss

[Victoria]: Safetycare Australia, [200-?]

1 videodisc (DVD) (ca. 15 min.) + facilitator's guide

This program aims to increase awareness of the hazards associated with noise in the workplace. While emphasising the fact that once hearing is damaged it cannot be repaired, it also reinforces the point that noise induced hearing loss is preventable. Topics covered include: causes of hearing loss; noise induced hearing loss - the basic facts; noise induced hearing loss - what damage is done to the ear; basic facts about sound and noise; the hearing test and audiogram; noise control measures; hearing protection.

Noise management

[Melbourne]: The Confederation, [198-]

1 videocassette (VHS) (40 min.)

The noise surrounds us (15 min.) -- The noise pounds us (8 min.) -- The noise controlled (17 min.)
Examines industrial noise and noise-induced hearing loss. Looks at different equipment used to measure noise in the workplace and solutions to reduce noise.

The noise was deafening

London: Millbank Films, 1982

1 videocassette (VHS) (20 min.)

Discusses how excessive noise can damage hearing and aims to make both management and employees aware of the irreversible effects of excessive noise, shows how noise surveys should be carried out, and highlights some of the methods by which excessive noise can be reduced.

Not at work, mate: a video and resource kit: supporting the Building Trades Group Drug and Alcohol Safety and Rehabilitation Program

Sydney: Building Trades Group of Unions, Drug and Alcohol Committee: Summer Hill Films (Producer), 1994.

1 videocassette (VHS) (18 min.)

This video deals with the Building Trades Group drug and alcohol safety rehabilitation program. It is designed to assist workers in recognising safety problems in the workplace that may be related to drug and alcohol use and to increase awareness of options for referral and assistance.

Occupational health and safety in the workplace

Bendigo, Vic.: Video Education Australasia, 1999.

1 videocassette (VHS) (8 min.)

This informative program is designed for use in a group setting to initiate discussion and awareness of the dangers of unsafe environments and work practices. Viewers are asked to identify the dangers in the program and think about how workplaces can be made safer and more efficient.

Office building fire safety: high rise

East Melbourne: Vocam, 2004.

1 videocassette (VHS) (15 min.)

For High Rise Buildings: Fires can occur in office buildings and the consequences can be devastating. An office fire can spread quickly, resulting in a large loss of life and damage to property. In a fire emergency, people can panic and behave in an irrational manner unless they

1 videodisc (DVD) (20 min.)

Investigates ways to prevent back injury in the office by showing how the back works, how to use it correctly and how to keep it in good shape. Case studies with solutions applicable to typical office manual handling problems are used to illustrate correct manual handling procedures. Topics covered in this program include: manual handling injuries; musculoskeletal disorders; how your back works; it could happen to you; an interview with an injured worker; manual handling risks factors; 9 case studies; principles of safe manual handling.

Office safety

[Australia]: Safety Care Australia, c1990.

Gives information on equipment used in TIG welding; types of electrodes; types of welds; procedures for setting up to weld and close down procedures. It also looks at workshop safety and personal safety.

To see another day

[Great Britain]: A Millbank production, [1985]

1 videocassette (VHS) (16 min.)

Tackles the attitudes of office staff who are lulled into a false belief that little or nothing can harm them in their place of work. Shows that whilst many of the hazards in industry are obvious, the dangers inherent in an office environment are not so apparent. Dramatised scenes deal with dangerous situations involving trips and falls, sharp instruments, electrical equipment, fire, and accidents caused by employee thoughtlessness and complacency.

Too close for comfort: near miss reporting and investigation

Glen Waverley, Vic.: Training Direct, 2001.

1 videorecording (VHS) (14 min.)

A near miss incident is an accident that almost happened. Outlines three different near misses, and how the organisations involved dealt with them, and the consequences that followed. It illustrates how proper reporting and investigation of near miss incidents can reduce accident numbers, when organisations act on recommendations from a near miss investigation.

Tools for metalwork

Mosman, N.S.W.: Health and Safety Resources [distributor], c1990.

1 videocassette (VHS) (ca.20 min.)

Shows the correct way to safely use metalwork tools including steel rules, scribes, try squares, punches, dividers, jenny calipers, hammers, files, chisels, hacksaws and the drill press.

Unclear and present danger: situation awareness at every level

Sydney: Futuremedia, 2009.

1 videodisc (DVD) (24 min.)

Situation Awareness is often referred to as "knowing what is going on around you" and a large proportion of errors attributed to workers actually stem from errors in their situation awareness. For workers and managers engaged in safety and quality critical tasks, developing a high level of situation awareness is a necessity. The program features world recognised expert on Situation Awareness, Professor Rhona Flin of the University of Aberdeen. The case studies illustrating lack of Situation Awareness include real examples from a range of industries including defence, healthcare, police, rail transport, manufacturing and chemicals and explosives.

Understanding eye safety at work

[Melbourne, Vic.: Safetycare Australia, 2003]

1 videodisc (DVD) (21 mins.)

Discusses the importance of eye safety in the workplace. Outlines 6 interactive case studies recreating the most common types of eye injuries at work. Highlights personal protective equipment (including maintenance and storage) as well as emergency response.

Understanding hazards and risks

[Australia]: Safetycare Australia, c2000?

1 videocassette (VHS) (20 min.)

The aim of this video based training program is to provide participants with a clear understanding of the terms hazard and risk and to increase their awareness about accident prevention. At the end

of this training session the participants will: Be able to define the term hazard; be able to define the term risk; be familiar with the factors necessary to make their workplace health and safety strategy a success; be able to state two methods of categorising workplace hazards; be aware of how they can personally contribute to preventing accidents in the workplace.

Understanding MSDs (Understanding musculoskeletal disorders)

Minneapolis, Minn.: Media Productions, 2000.

1 videocassette (VHS) (14 min.)

With the average total cost of a musculoskeletal disorder injury rising to over \$10,000, you can't afford to ignore aches and pains in your workplace. This program is designed to educate on how to implement an effective and comprehensive system for identifying and reducing the risk of MSDs in the workplace. The program emphasises the importance of early reporting of MSDs so that employee reports of pain or discomfort can be addressed simply and inexpensively.

Understanding safety in the office

[East Melbourne, Vic.]: Vocam Worldwide Publishing, c2005.

1 videocassette (VHS) (20 min.)

An organisation can minimise the risks of accidents and incidents by ensuring all office employees understand safety in the office. Topics covered include office housekeeping, your workstation, and safety around the office, manual handling, emergency response, and office security and aggression response.

U.V. and heat awareness

[Niddrie, Vic]: Vocam Video Training Productions, [c1994]

1 videocassette (VHS) (15 min.)

Identifies the major types of (weather) hazards for outdoor workers; shows how to assess the risks and ways to eliminate or reduce them and finally first aid treatment for victims is covered.

VDU and workstation ergonomics

[Airport West, Vic.] : Vocam, c1994

1 videocassette (VHS) (23 min.)

Looks at workstation hazards. It includes: analysis of hazards; posture; design and layout of workstations; lighting and routines.

Vehicle safety on farms: films to improve safety on the farm

Sudbury, Suffolk: Health and Safety Executive, c2007.

1 videodisc (DVD) (c86 min.)

This DVD consists of the following farm safety films: "Riding for a fall" - features dramatic representations and real life cases to emphasise the need for training to ensure safe driving of ATVs. "A ridge too far: - a useful reminder of basic ATV safety procedures, covering checking tyre pressures, steering and brakes, how to load an ATV, towing trailers, stability and negotiating steep hillsides safely." "Fatal traction" - highlights the dangers and gives practical advice to agriculture and forestry workers on how to avoid them. It includes graphic reconstructions of fatal accidents and interviews with families of victims and gives examples of simple control measures that can help reduce the risks. "Tractor action" - uses realistic dramatisations to describe safe working practices for tractor operation. It is aimed at younger workers but is also of value to any users of tractors or tractor-operated machinery. "Safe driving on slopes" - informs and instructs people on the dangers and safe methods of driving farm vehicles and machinery on slopes.

Violence at work: managing the problem

[Airport West, Vic.] : Vocam Video Training Productions, c1997.

1 videocassette (VHS) (22 min.)

This video examines the various manifestations of workplace violence, including bullying, sexual harassment, and physical and verbal confrontation, and demonstrates what both employers and employees can do to defuse such incidents and minimize their occurrence.

This video identifies potential attackers and situations where workplace violence may occur. Provides strategies to avoid potential threat and for incident reporting.

This video explains how to avoid back injuries by use of good lifting and carrying techniques and back stretching and strengthening exercises, demonstrating good warehouse manual handling techniques.

Warehouse manual handling 2010

Camberwell, Vic.: Vocam, c2009.

1 videodisc (DVD) (19 min.)

Unsafe manual handling is the most common cause of work related injuries. These injuries cause personal suffering and loss of income, and also cost businesses and national economies. Injuries that arise from hazardous manual handling are commonly known as musculoskeletal disorders or MSDs. Any worker can be affected, yet MSDs can be prevented by assessing work tasks, consulting with colleagues, putting in place preventive measures, and checking that these measures stay effective.

Warehouse manual handling: the new approach

This video tells the harrowing real story of Lee Birks whose life was irreversibly changed when he witnessed a workplace accident. A powerful reminder of our vulnerability at work.

Work safety: it all begins with you!

This general safety video looks at issues such as: sun protection; personal protective equipment; hazardous substances; housekeeping and lifting procedures.
